The Chinese phrase on the front

年年有余

(say "nee-en nee-en yo yew")
means to have more than enough every
year. This is a common wish for Chinese
New Year.

Why the picture of a fish? The last
character of the phrase, which means
"abundance," sounds the same as the
word for fish, so pictures of fish are often
used to represent abundance.
